Northern Hills Academy

The month of March at Northern Hills Academy was all about celebrating our love of reading through Read Across America Week/Month. read stories to our students, helping to inspire a love for reading! To commemorate the week, we organized a spirit week with the following themed days:

On March 13th, our staff members engaged in a professional development presentation led by Cara Faris, one of our student's parents, who presented on American Sign Language (ASL). The session was both informative and interactive, providing our team with the chance to learn a variety of signs that will enhance our communication with students. With Cara's expertise and enthusiasm, our staff left the presentation feeling empowered and excited to incorporate ASL into their daily interactions, fostering a more inclusive and supportive learning environment for all students.

Our school community came together to participate in an Autism Walk, celebrating neurodiversity and fostering awareness and inclusion. This event brought together students, staff, and parents, all of whom took part in the walk, alongside engaging in a variety of crafts and sensory activities designed to be both fun and educational. The event highlighted our commitment to creating an inclusive environment where all individuals are celebrated for their unique abilities. Each year the Autism Walk has become a cherished tradition within the Northern Hills community.

being implemented by different sites.

- John O'Hara has attended the AHS round table community meeting for the Nursing Department. It was a nice panel of former nurses asking us questions about the nursing staff at AHS- I believe it went very well.

- John O'Hara has attended and ran a table handing out flyers and business cards at the "Future Fair" a transition fair. at Mt. Olive High School to promote Project SEARCH on March 27th From 5:30 pm -8:00 pm and will be attending another Transition Fair at the Calais School in April.

It is that time of year where the non-public schools are trying to schedule all of their Spring Assessments so that determinations can be made for students eligibility for Fall 2025 eligibility under Chapter 192. Our teachers are working closely with the non public schools to ensure this occurs.
